

### MANY REGISTER FOR RESERVE CORPS

Corbin Reports 500 Applicants Examined Tuesday. Applications Will Be Received Until Midnight of May 7.

With increasing interest manifested in the training course for the officers reserve corps to be opened at Fort McPherson on May 15, a larger number of applicants than usual registered yesterday at the office of Edward W. Clark, in charge of the work for Georgia.

Captain Corbin stated on Tuesday that applications would continue to be received even to midnight, May 7, unless the required 1,500 successful applicants had been secured. He said that in case this number of men were not secured by that time it was possible that the time would be extended even longer.

Captain Corbin stated that 500 applications had been approved by the office on Tuesday night. Fort McPherson has the lowest number of applicants, according to dispatches from New York, and these numbers are reports of an excess of men for the western states.

Matured men are particularly desired, near the age of 35 years and with some business experience. It was announced on Tuesday that the office on the sixth floor of the Empire building, suite 304, will open at 9 o'clock in the morning and close at 5 o'clock. Major Brown will remain in the office during these hours to make preliminary examinations.

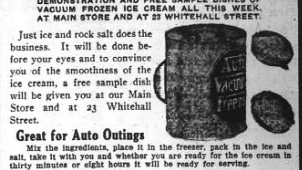

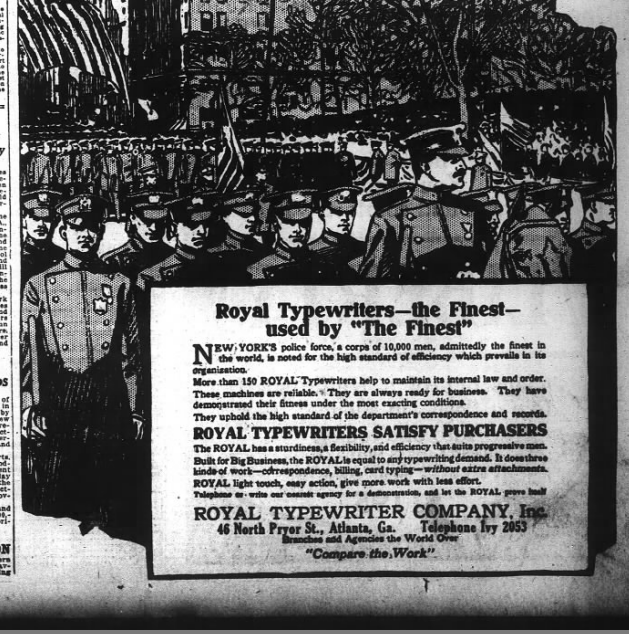
