witnessed the interview.

We were indeed proud
of being invited to the
Golden Jubilee Banquet.

Greatly do we appreciate
our Christmas card from
the Dubois family, whom

whom we so sadly miss.

Atlanta the body of Mrs
M. A. McNeil, Mother of Mrs Adrien
Herndon

Funeral Tuesday am from
Herndon residence -

Just eight years from day
and hour that we laid to rest
the body of the daughter, Adrienne
